# A Time of Transition

Greetings in the name of Christ!

The words of the author of Ecclesiastes ring true during this time in the life of the church. In times of transition, so many different emotions and feelings come out. Especially in an unplanned, late in the appointment season announcement of a pastor's departure. While we do not have an announcement for a permanent pastor for Great Bend First UMC currently, we do have plans to share with you to ensure leadership in the interim.

First, let me introduce myself. I'm Rev. Zach Anderson, and as of July 1<sup>st</sup>, I am the district superintendent that relates to Great Bend. At the recent session of the Great Plains Annual Conference, members approved new district boundaries in our conference. I am now the superintendent of the Western Kansas District. This district brings together the Dodge City and Hays districts, and parts of the Hutchinson and Wichita West districts. Transitions are all around!

Starting July 1<sup>st</sup>, I will be one of two pastors who will be helping cover your congregation. I will be with you in worship at least once a month to preach and offer the sacraments. Along with me will be Rev. Richard Fitzgerald. Rev. Fitzgerald is on conference staff as a Conference Circuit Pastor. He will also preach monthly and help schedule the Sundays he or I are not present. I will be meeting weekly with staff to make sure the administrative and program plans continue to move forward. As for pastoral care, we are in the process of finalizing those plans to have someone who will take care of those needs on a regular schedule who can be in the community. Rev. Fitzgerald and I will also step into those roles as needed.

I'm looking forward to being in worship with you in the interim period and getting to know your congregation more. The Staff-Parish Relations Committee and I realize this is not the plan we hoped to have in place, but I'm grateful we are able to walk alongside you and offer leadership to keep your ministry and witness for Christ moving forward in the Great Bend community.

I will be preaching July 7<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> and look forward to our shared journey together.
