You can find it in *The Faith We Sing* #2222. Matthew 20:26b-28 provides the primary scriptural background for the song: ". . . Whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave — just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." (NIV)

I will hold the Christ-light for you Brother, sister, let me serve you, let me be as Christ to you; in the night-time of your fear; pray that I may have the grace to I will hold my hand out to you, speak the peace you long to hear. let you be my servant, too. I will weep when you are weeping; We are pilgrims on a journey; we're together on this road. when you laugh, I'll laugh with you. I will share your joy and sorrow We are here to help each other walk the mile and bear the load. till we've seen this journey through.

Hearing the song again during this season of life, I was caught by how interconnected our lives are to be and how much we are to serve one another.

I often get asked what hope is there for the church. In this text from Matthew 20 and these lyrics it shows us if we journey together, focus on serving and caring, then we will be walking in the ways of God through the light of Jesus Christ.

This should be our guiding force in division, fear, and incivility we see all around us.


