Make the Most of Every Opportunity!

Dear members and friends of Great Bend First UMC,

Greetings in the name of our eternal Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ!

As we journey through the new year 2025, I want to take a moment to remind you that time is flying by quickly. It's hard to believe that we're already a few weeks into the year. As Christians, we are to be more aware that we live in the present, but we live for the future. We are called to make every day count and every opportunity precious, so that our tomorrows are fruitful and fulfilling for us and others.



In Psalm 90:12, Moses prays, "Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." This scripture reminds us to make the most of the time we have, to prioritize our lives, and to seek wisdom from God. In Colossians 4:5, Paul writes, "Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity." This verse encourages us to be intentional about how we live our lives, to make the most of every opportunity, and to be wise in our interactions with others. In 1 Peter 4:2, Peter reminds us, "Live for the rest of your earthly life no longer by human desires but by the will of God." This scripture challenges us to live our lives according to God's will, to seek His purposes, and to prioritize His desires above our own.

As John Calvin once wrote, "Our wisdom consists in living not for ourselves, but for God." May we keep this wisdom at the forefront of our minds as we navigate the ups and downs of life. John Wesley also reminded us, "Do not quench the Spirit. Do not be anxious to be always doing something. Wait on the Lord, and be ready to do what He bids you. 'Redeem the time,' but do not hurry." As I reflect on the rapid passage of time, I am reminded of a story about a man who was given a small bag of gold coins. Each day, he was instructed to take one coin out of the bag and use it to make a positive impact on someone's life. At the end of each day, he was to reflect on how he had used the coin. As the days went by, the man realized that the coins were dwindling, and he began to make every

A new monthly observance will take place during both services on the second Sunday of each month.


People who are celebrating their birthdays and couples celebrating wedding

Buckets are filled with bottles of liquid laundry detergent, household cleaner, and liquid dish soap; air freshener; insect repellant; scrub brush; cleaning wipes; scouring pads; clothespins and clothesline; trash bags; respirator dust masks; and kitchen gloves.

Our Altar Guild is already deciding on how to best display the tree during Advent 2025.


Along with the tree, there will be materials purchased to make new "Chrismon" ornaments (ie. ornaments with symbols of Christianity on them) to go on the tree.
